EARLY LEARNING & CHILD CARE CERTIFICATE

The Early Learning & Child Care Certificate program trains professionals to work with children from birth to eight years, with some related preparation for working with children from eight to twelve years of age. There is an emphasis on developing caring relationships with children and families. Instruction is part-time, blended, supported by facilitated learning sites. The majority of this program is offered online.

EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANT CERTIFICATE

Graduates assist teachers in both instructional and non-instructional tasks. This program trains students in a wide range of interpersonal and practical skills needed for such work. Part-time, online, supported by facilitated learning sites.

MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE

The Management Certificate provides basic business skills training which may assist students in securing management positions. The Certificate also provides students with opportunities to further advance their studies at RDC in the field of business. Part-time, online, supported by facilitated learning sites.

PRE-EMPLOYMENT WELDING - SUNDRE

With great demand for welders, this program provides relevant training and hands-on experience. The twelve week program will prepare participants for entry level welding jobs and upon successful completion of the pre-employment training, students will be able to challenge their first year Apprenticeship Technical Exam.
