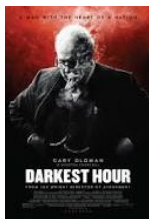
The Darkest Hour

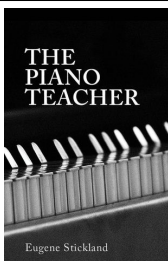

INTRO TO HORSES AND HORSE COURSE 101

New Program for Homeschool Students

Welcome to Horse Course, a hands on learning experience that can benefit students ages 8-18 physically, mentally, emotionally, socially, and spiritually through building relationships with our gentle horses and certified instructors.

Intro to Horses is a 90 minute program that allows them to test drive the full course. It is perfect for younger riders or those unsure of their comfort level with horses. Students are NOT required to take this course prior to beginning Horse Course 101.

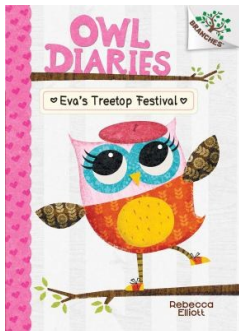

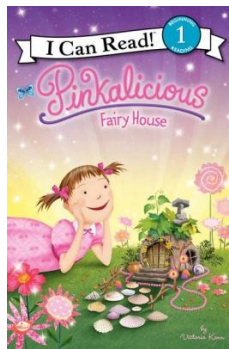
OWL DIARIES-EVA'S TREETOP FESTIVAL

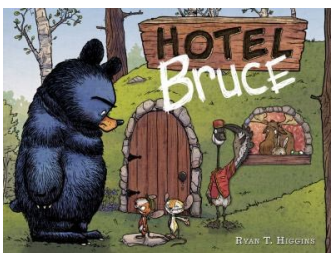

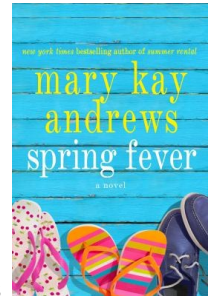
SPLINTERED by A. G. Howard

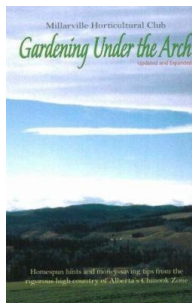
SPRING FEVER by Mary Kay Andrews
