

The Library Is Hiring!

The Cremona Library is looking to hire a casual library assistant. Hours will consist of both day and evening shifts. Starting wage is \$15/hour. Resumes can be dropped off at the Village office or emailed to cremonalibrary@prl.ab.ca Attn: Tracy Westerson. Closing date is September 18th at 4pm. Only successful candidates will be contacted for an interview.

The library expansion is still underway, however we are hopeful that we will be able to hold our grand re-opening at the end of September. If you are unable to get to one of our fellow libraries, you can order books from the online library system. You can have books mailed to your home address and then mail them back to their home library. These are the instructions for ordering books online:

1. Go to www.prl.ab.ca
2. Click on Login, at the top right-hand corner
3. Enter your 14 digit card number which can be found on the back of your library card
4. Enter the last 4 digits of your phone number in the PIN area
5. Once you are logged in, you can see details of your account, including overdue books, fines, and books you currently have checked out.
6. Use the search bar to find the book you are looking for. You can search by title, author, keyword or subject
7. Once you find the book, click on request and use the drop down menu to choose “mail to my address”, click Place Request and then OK.
8. Your book will be mailed to your home address along with a return postage slip for you to attach when returning the book through the mail.

Should you encounter any problems during the process you can contact the Parkland Library help desk at 1.800.567.9024 during the Cremona Library closure.
